CYRUS II (the Great)	559 - 530 B.C.
	(Founder of the Persian Empire) (Return of Zerubbabel and Jeshua)
CAMBYSES II	530 - 522 B.C.
	(Co-regent from 538 to 530 B.C.) (Rebuilding at Jerusalem stopped)
GAUMATA (a usurper; also called Smerdis or Bardiya)	522 B.C.
DARIUS I (Hystaspes)	521 - 486 B.C.
	(Known as “Darius the Great” - Behistun Inscription) (Haggai and Zechariah prophesied; Temple completed)
XERXES I (Ahasuerus)	485 - 465 B.C.
	(Story of Esther)
ARTAXERXES I (Longimanus)	464 - 424 B.C.
	(Return of Ezra, Return of Nehemiah, Ministry of Malachi)
DARIUS II (Nothus)	423 – 405 B.C.
ARTAXERXES II (Mnemnon)	404 - 359 B.C.
ARTAXERXES III (Ochus)	358 - 338 B.C.
ARSES	337 - 336 B.C.
DARIUS III (Codomanus)	335 - 330 B.C.
-- ALEXANDER THE GREAT = 336 -323 B.C. --
